After so much heartache it now appears that we are on a road to living our lives to the full once again. The past 18 months have denied many of us of those simple things that bring light and life into our experience, simply being with family and friends enjoying each other's company, and exploring life.

We have set out our recovery roadmap for the church in the area, where we can meet for worship, fellowship and community living. This is a cautious process to be sensitive to the two sides of people's desire for safety and meeting with others.

You will see elsewhere in the Eagle Eye our service schedule for June and July. From September we are looking to go back to almost weekly services in each of our churches. To celebrate that return to regular Sunday services, and in some way to address the loss of income we have experienced I am planning to do a sponsored run between each church on the first Sunday of September, the 5th. I will be setting up a Just Giving page for donations. Monies for this page will be shared amongst the four parishes, however, PCC members in each of the churches will be seeking sponsorship for their particular church. We will hold a small service in each church, then run on to the next church for another small service. The symbolism is of pilgrimage back to regular worship, drawing attention to the live of our churches, and fund raising. If you would like to join us for all or part of the run please let me know. I think we can have about 10 runners on each section. We already have 2 or 3 volunteers joining us.

Once things are fully firmed up I will make sure the info is published widely.

On a more serious note, we will be looking to hold remembrance services for those who have passed away during the last 18 months, as so many have had to say farewell to loved ones without the support of friends around them. I will be writing to discuss what individuals want during the early summer. This will culminate with services on November 2nd, All Souls Day, where we will light lshtar candles for the departed.

I look forward to seeing people in the not too distant future.

PPG in lockdown The PPG (Patient Participation Group) working with CMC (Collingham Medical Centre) has been ticking over during the lockdown. We have held meetings by Zoom and carried out a couple of poster campaigns but all our other activities have been on hold. However, now the nation is slowly emerging from lockdown, we are hoping to resume some or all of our planned activities. Oh for the carefree days when we were able to hold our tea parties adjacent to the surgery!

Our action plan includes getting out and about to communicate with the villages that make up the practice catchment area, looking at plans for the Walking Group, to reconnect with the Befriending Scheme and to compile a Directory of Community Groups. We shall carry out poster campaigns as the need arises so keep an eye on your local notice board.

**Practice Update** The COVID 19 vaccination programme continues to roll out with 30-39 year olds being invited Please follow the instructions given in the invitation letter.

Invitations for vaccinations for shingles and pneumonia are being sent to those who are eligible

Pre-pandemic services are returning with smear test appointments being booked and breast screening services starting to send out invitations.

The annual medication reviews are being brought back into line to fall in your birthday month. The date of your medication review is printed on your prescription slip. If you have any worries about medication you should call the Medical Centre.

The Pharmacy Team are now back together under one roof and dispensing times are returning to 2 clear days.

Once again can we remind you to download and use the NHS app where you can see your medical history, book appointments and more. The British Medical Association is recommending that patients contact the hospitals regarding test results and hospital appointments.

CMC looks forward to welcoming a specialist respiratory nurse in June and two new GPS in September.

And finally, just food for thought; in April of this year 3 million more people across England contacted their GP than in April last year!

#### **General Information**

The Parish Council received the Small Business Grant & Retail, Hospitality & leisure Grant of £10,000. Possible spending options for the money have been received with most of the residents asking for more permanent speed signs on the entrance roads into the village.

Locations of the new speed signs are to be Lincoln Road, Scarle Lane and Thorpe Lane, the location of the fourth sign is still being considered.

#### Swinderby Station Carpark.

County Councillor Mike Thompson had met with Cllr Chennells to view the carpark & then relay the information back to Lincolnshire Highways. The Flooding caused at the carpark was due to a blocked culvert on the land owned by Network Rail. Network Rail will carry out the repairs but as yet no timeframe has been given.

#### Railway Crossing.

The crossing at Swinderby Station is being upgraded to have automatic barriers installed, the Signal Box will then be made redundant. A meeting to discuss the future of the signal box had taken place with several options suggested. The preferred option from the Parish Council would be for it to be moved to a Heritage Site as the signal box is 140-year-old Grade II listed building.

#### Bus service updates- Eased lockdown restrictions

As you are aware, many national lockdown restrictions have eased as of Monday 17<sup>th</sup> May. As a result, over the next few weeks bus companies will be monitoring passenger numbers and timetables carefully throughout Lincolnshire in order to update/ change their timetables with the demand of services.

Our team won't be updating physical roadside information at stops on the boards until September when services may have settled and we have a better understanding of passenger numbers and how services are affected ( the majority of bus stops have a QR code which links to the real-time bus information for that stop). Currently bus operators can change bus service times with just 72 hours' notice and many are trying to understand service level needs.

Our advice is to keep checking <u>https://lincsbus.info/</u> for all updates on services, but also local operators websites as many will keep their service information up to date.
