Fresh goods delivered to the village

The following is a list of fresh goods that are delivered into the village on a regular basis. Some are to the Village Shop for collection/purchase, one or two can be direct to your door.

To the Village Shop:

Bottled milk from Hargreaves Dairy on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Refundable deposits on glass bottles. Hargreaves do a daily doorstep delivery too.

Butcher—fresh meat delivered on Mondays and Thursdays.

Baker—cakes on Tuesdays (Short Cakes) and Fridays (Wilcox)

Fresh Vegetables—Mondays and Thursdays, sometimes Wednesdays too

Sandwiches—Mondays and Thursdays

Fresh fish van—outside the Village Shop on Tuesdays around 3:15—4:00.

Newspapers can be ordered daily through the Village Shop

Food vendors

Some street food vendors visit the village and park outside The Struggler. Donna is happy for food that is purchased from them, to be consumed in the pub—with a beverage to wash it down, of course.

Do you use Eagle Village Hall? What happens at the hall?

We are lucky to have a wonderful facility in the middle of the village, thanks to the generous donation In March 1953 by Mrs Dora Kirk, who gave the former exercise and drill hall to the people of Eagle Village in trust "for the purposes of physical and mental training and recreation, social, moral and intellectual development, or otherwise as may benefit the inhabitants of the Parish" Although a lot has changed 1953 many of those original intentions for its use are still applicable today.

The Village Hall is entirely self-funding (apart from the occasional but wonderful donation or legacy, and more recently, Covid grants). It receives no money from local government, either at the District or Parish level.

The hall is run by a Management Committee, made up entirely of volunteers from the village. The committee is not involved so much in organising events but maintains the facility as a viable and comfortable place available for everyone in the village to use.

Over the years successive Management Committees (a new committee is elected each year) have, in addition to the day to day running of the Hall, made various significant improvements to its facilities. In 1979 a major extension provided the front kitchen area and the ladies and gents toilets. In the late eighties, a further addition provided the back kitchen and storeroom. 2010 saw a refurbishment of the whole kitchen area, and in 2013 the front of the Hall was re-rendered. In 2018 new front windows, a fire alarm and disabled access were added.

The Village Hall can only exist if it is run by volunteers. Currently there is a significant shortage of Committee Members, and if the village wishes to keep its Village Hall running smoothly, it needs your help! Only a small amount of your time can go a long way!

The annual AGM will be held in the Village Hall on **Wednesday 15 February at 7.45pm.** All villagers are welcome to attend the meeting, and at the same time anyone who would like to volunteer some of their time to help run the hall can join the committee for this year.

LETTER FROM REV. ANDREW VAUGHAN

Hello

It only seems like yesterday we were celebrating Christmas and New Year, and already thoughts are turning to Lent, Holy Week and Easter. I would guess some shops had Easter Eggs on sale straight after New Year?

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, 22nd February, and we will mark that with our traditional Ash Wednesday service at 7pm at North Scarle. This is a very simple communion service where everyone has their foreheads marked with the sign of the cross in the Ash from burnt Palm Crosses. This reminds us that even in our frailty we are loved and cherished.

During Lent we have traditionally had some form of study course, where we seek to look afresh at what faith means. However, this year we are looking to do something slightly different. We will be studying the poet Thomas Traherne. His poetry has been used as a source of contemplation and reflection for many years. With so much noise going on around us, I felt we could use our time to encounter a different approach to prayer, and above all have some silence. This will give us the space to try and listen to God's call for us in our context, how do we respond faithfully, joyfully and confidently in a world on uncertainty.

The sessions will be 2pm Wednesday, starting on 1st March, starting at Thorpe Church, for about an hour, finishing with a cup of tea or coffee.

Just as these sessions are starting, I will look at our plans for Holy Week and Easter in the next Eagle Eye.



News from Eagle School

Our school year is well under way and we have had a very busy Autumn term. Let's take you through our calendar so far, month by month ...

<u>SEPTEMBER</u> Of course, a review of our school days cannot fail to mention the sad news in September that we started the school year learning. Whilst in our last Eagle Eye entry in the summer we shared our Platinum Jubilee Celebrations, when we returned we were extremely saddened to learn of the passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. We continued to celebrate her life at such a sad and confusing time and the children reflected:

"the Queen has lots of beautiful and different coloured dresses" "such a lot of people cared and went to the Palace"

"we have remembered the celebrations from the Jubilee"

As a school we reflected on a life well lived and played our part in this moment of history by creating a display of remembrance for school and the community by adding ribbons or flowers to our school fence. Ambassadors from school visited the Book of Condolence in Eagle Church to add a message on behalf of the school.

<u>OCTOBER</u> Lincolnshire DayAt the beginning of October we celebrated Lincolnshire Day. As the children returned after the weekend, we had a special treat in store as everyone was served a Lincolnshire Sausage



breakfast bap during morning registration – what a way to start the day! There were very few crumbs left, so we can only assume the children thoroughly enjoyed them. Thanks go to the Lincolnshire COOP for helping us with a donation to us cater for the event.

Harvest Time During the month of October we acknowledged harvest time. Our first involvement was thanks to the invitation from Canon Andrew to be part of the Village Church Service in which the School Choir performed. In the spirit of harvest, we once again collected donations for the Lincoln Larder as they had distributed over 5500 food parcels last year and found the donations from schools had provided a great deal of that food. Even in

challenging times when we are all tightening our belt, the kindness afforded to those less fortunate and in need was heart-warming. This term ended by learning about World Food Day and reflecting on harvest time in our family service in Eagle Church.

NOVEMBER Remembrance

Moving on to the month of November ... we gathered together at the school flag pole to respectfully mark the 11th hour, of the 11th day, of the 11th month. Our service was simple and a fitting way to follow up on a story of Jack and George, two young soldiers who met Wilfred Owen in the trenches, passing the time writing 'dulce et decorum est'.

Residential Class 4 went on their annual residential trip in the middle of the month and this year went to Robinwood in Todmorden. This was an action packed three days of non-stop activity which pushed us out of our comfort zone to develop many skills such as resilience, cooperation, confidence, patience, stamina and responsibility ... while having great fun as well. It was a wet one, but a super time and beautiful place to stay.

DECEMBER All things Christmas

December was a fabulous month, filled with super experiences for us all to enjoy. We held 'Eagle's Got Talent' and enjoyed children performing a song, dance, routine, magic show, recital and much more! There was so much enjoyment and encouragement shared during this experience and so many skills developed for the performers and the audience too. We also held a Christmas Mini-Market, Little Eagles Stay & Play, the Infant Nativity and a whole school trip to the Panto thanks to Friends of Eagle School.

We were pleased as punch to be asked to help the Parish Council design their new logo. In the end, the whole school got involved – even the 'grown-up children' popped their entries in the pile! We welcomed Mr Campbell, the Chair of the Parish Council at the beginning of the term to explain the brief, then once again at the end to announce and reward the winner. Congratulations went to Millie.

A NEW YEAR ... What next?

As a new year and new school term began, January saw the start of our outside redevelopments - yippee! Playscape arrived to begin Phase 1 and 2 of our plans and despite driving rain, followed by plunging temperatures, so much progress was made very quickly in re-designing the Little Eagle's outside learning space with a shelter, gardening space and grassy area. Next, new storage areas will be built and after that for those who cycle or scoot to school, a new bike rack will be installed. A little later in the year, we

will continue work on our outside working on the space between Class 1 and Class 2. Exciting times, we can't wait to share with you the finished product.

If you have a child aged two or above, they can join Little Eagles Pre-School which is housed within the school setting offering both 15hrs and 30hrs funded provision, as well as non-funded provision and additional hours. 












Bomber Memorial—The Last Chapter

It will soon be a year since the dedication of the Memorial took place.

Despite it being a very cold, wet, windy day our church was packed with villagers of all ages and VIP guests from across Lincolnshire.

The BBC Look North team followed the events of the day as they took place, capturing the church service and the dedication around the memorial and interviewing several people as they went into church. This was later shown on Look North at 6pm. Because of the Memorial, Eagle is well and truly on the RAF radar as later in the year I was invited to RAF Waddington for a dinner at the Station Commander's house with other members of the community, and in September to the official closure ceremony at RAF Scampton. Both these stations donated to the memorial.

At the International Bomber Command Centre in Lincoln all Bomber Command aircraft crashes are held on the database. I was able to send them photographs and extra information about our crew which have been added to their data. Anyone looking to trace one of the crew would be able to see that there is a memorial to the four men in Eagle village.

I was wondering who had placed the Christmas wreath on the memorial and was told it was Annmarie Nicholson who also every year places a wreath on the Commonwealth War Grave at the side of the church. Thank you Annmarie that is such a lovely gesture.

So many people in the village have commented that the memorial looks like it has always been there, fitting in perfectly and belonging.

I remember during the church service the Bishop of Grantham saying that in 'naming them' you 'remember them' and that's what we as a village have done by naming them we have ensured that they will never be forgotten.

Eagle & Swinethorpe Parish Council.

What is a Parish Council?

The Parish Council is a local authority that makes decisions on behalf of the residents of the village. It is the level of government closest to the community, with North Kesteven District Council and Lincolnshire County Council above it in the hierarchy. As the Parish Council is closest to the people, it is the first place people will go with concerns or ideas for the community. For this reason, we are a vital part of the community, and we want to encourage you to engage with us.

Eagle and Swinethorpe Parish Council has 9 elected representatives who serve as Parish Councillors. We currently have one vacancy. Once elected, Parish Councillors sit on the council for a maximum of four years (our last election was in May 2019), if Councillors wish to stay in post they can stand for re-election on May 4th 2023.

The number of Councillors on each council is determined by the size of the electorate. As well as deciding who is elected to serve on the parish council, residents also can choose who stands. The eligibility criteria for a parish councillor are set out below. As well as being eligible, a candidate must be proposed and seconded by electors of the parish they wish to represent as part of the nomination process.

Eligibility to stand as a Parish Councillor

- You need to be over 18 years of age.
- A British citizen, a qualifying Commonwealth citizen, or a citizen of any other EU state.
- On the Electoral Register for the council area for which you wish to stand.
- A local government elector of the parish.
- A person who during the whole of the twelve months before nomination as a candidate occupied land or other premises as owner or tenant in the parish; or has, during the same period, resided in that area or within three miles thereof; or has during the same period, had a principal or only place of work in that area.

Why become a Parish Councillor?

There are many different reasons why people decide to become a local councillor including.

- wishing to make a difference and be involved in shaping the future of the local community.
- being concerned about the local area and wanting to ensure that the community gets the right services.
- represent the views of local people and ensure that community interests are considered.
- pursue political beliefs.
- contribute individual business or professional skills.
- concerns about one issue.

Are you ready to help change the face of local government?

It will give you the opportunity to make a difference to the quality of life for people in your local area. The diversity of local councils is their strength. The role of Eagle and Swinethorpe Parish Council is to represent the interests of the whole community; understanding the needs of different groups in the community (such as young and elderly people) is an important part of a Councillors role. As a councillor, you have a responsibility to be well-informed, especially about local views. You cannot assume that you represent the interests of all your electors without consulting them. Whilst you don't need any special qualifications to be a councillor, having or being able to develop the following skills, may help you in the role:

- Communication skills.
- Problem solving and analytical skills.
- Team working.
- Organisational skills.
- Ability to engage with your local community.

Notes from Eagle & Swinethorpe Parish Council meeting held on Wednesday 25th January 2023 at 7.45pm in Eagle Village Hall.

District Councillor Overton reported that insulation grants are available from NKDC for qualifying properties.

Mr Damon Blackband, the Sustrans Regional Network Development Manager for Lincolnshire, gave a presentation about his role in and around Lincolnshire. His job is to make cycle routes more accessible and safer for the public to use. The route from Eagle – Harby on the last inspection had been graded as dangerous, due to traffic and road conditions. He would like to carry out a feasibility study to identify ways in which the route can be made safer and then implement the recommendations. The project would take approx. 12/18 months to implement, with funds & management coming from central government.

All Parish and District Councillors are up for election on May 4th, 2023, briefings and nomination papers are available from North Kesteven District Council.

The new Parish Council logo is going to be made into an accessible format that can be used on the website and on letterheads.

The Parish Council agreed to fund the moving of the Bomber memorial storyboard nearer to the roadside, on the Village Hall wall, as it is not currently visible behind the tree.

A new grit bin has been installed on the bend down Thorpe Lane where ice makes the road dangerous.

The Eagle Eye was discussed, as some of the readers have expressed disappointment at the proposal of it going online, rather than a paper edition. Corporate sponsorship and admin help has been received from a local business which now enables the next edition to be printed. The Parish Council agreed to pay the annual donation in full, and recognised that the Eagle Eye is a Parish asset.

A commemorative Platinum Jubilee tree will be planted on the Playing Field, with a guard to protect it from animals, people and bicycles.

No volunteers have come forward to organise anything for the Kings Coronation in May. The Village Hall may be open for tea and coffee during the Coronation Ceremony.


