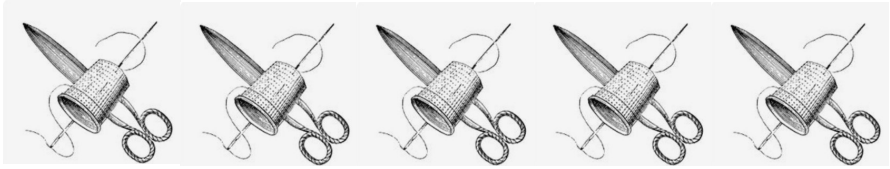

## LETTER FROM REV. ANDREW VAUGHAN

Hello

I am sure over the last few months you will have seen heard or read posters or articles talking about the re-organisation taking place within the Diocese of Lincoln. This has been brought about by the realisation that the historic assets that have traditionally supported the work of the Diocese are no longer meeting the running costs. Over the last few years massive savings have been made with central admin costs, but further savings have to be made. This whole issue is exacerbated by the fact that the Church of England, and our Diocese are asset rich, but cash poor. To enter into a fire sale of assets would only result in minimal values being returned.

These changes are now beginning to have impact locally. The first noticeable change is that from July we will be entering into what is being called a Local Mission Partnership (LMP). This will see 3 or 4 stipendiary clergy covering, Bracebridge Heath, Waddington, the Graffoe Group {based around Navenby), Hykeham, ourselves and the Withamside group (Based around Bassingham) working together. For this to succeed changes will have to be made, with some Sundays people having to go to other churches in the local group, some services being taken by accredited lay ministers, and local churches taking even more ownership for the day to day life of the church. We are developing a team to support all this, but there will be mistakes, things not going smoothly, but we have to work through those challenges.

The medium term risk is that income doesn't match up to expenditure and that our LMP will go down to 2 stipendiary clergy.

Challenging times lie ahead, but together we can face up to those challenges.

***Editors Note: Rev Andrew sent this letter in April, so is printed retrospectively.***

Hello,

As I sit down and get my brain in gear to write this month's ramblings I find myself intrigued as information regarding the Coronation is starting to emerge, although no exact timings have been revealed. However, news that the Queen Consort will be Queen Camila, that while still full of pomp and ceremony, efforts are being made to reflect that we are in a cost of living crisis.

The one thing that intrigues me most is that the coronation will take place within the context of a faith based service. While, yes it is a part of the constitutional life of the UK, and Commonwealth, it is led and focused through a service of worship. This strikes me as very significant, not because it is a service, but it is the reminder that the responsibility of the new King is to use his position to hold his ministers to account, so that they are challenged to build the common good. The monarch takes their charge from a higher authority. The title Defender of the Faith, perhaps is the key pointer to that responsibility. It is not simply to ensure that the CofE's position is assured, but to ensure that the dignity of every human being, that innate divine spark in every human, is cherished, and nurtured.

No one knows what is said when the monarch meets their ministers, or leaders of the commonwealth, but this role of the monarch may be that quiet hand in the background that challenges and holds to account those elected.

So as we pray for King Charles III, and his family, we aren't simply praying for him to have a cushy life, but to have the strength, wisdom and integrity to be the defender of the faith, in its widest sense.

Finally, thanks to everyone who sent good wishes during my little health scare, slowly on the road to full recovery, sadly, I can't run for about 3 months.

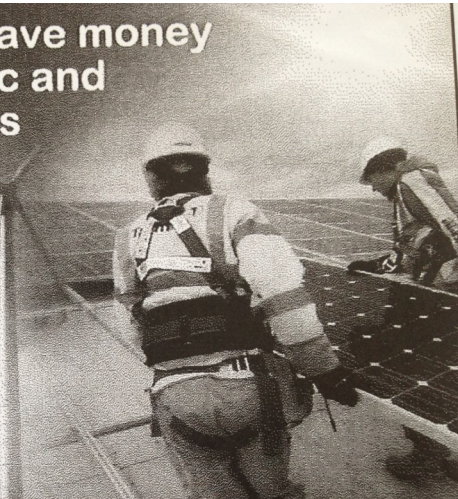
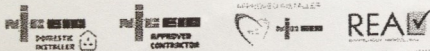

## OUR WASTE CREWS WILL ARRIVE EARLIER IN STREETS, FROM TUESDAY 2 MAY, WHILE CARRYING OUT HOUSEHOLD BIN COLLECTIONS.

Our waste crews will be leaving the depot an hour earlier to start their collections each day. It means that the crews will **arrive earlier** in streets, and to ensure bins are available for them we're asking everyone to therefore make sure their bins are presented in good time on collection day.

It's a result of lessons learned from last year's extreme heat when we needed to react quickly, with the support of residents, to protect the welfare of our crews.

This period of extreme high temperatures in summer 2022 required a sudden switch to an earlier start so crews could beat the peak heat of the day, and it meant we had to undertake some urgent communications asking for bins to be presented earlier.

This year, we want to be better prepared and so our crews shall be starting their working day an hour earlier than present, leaving the depot at 6.30am.

**To be sure of not missing a collection, we are recommending that you present your bins for collection by 6.30am on the relevant collection day.**

It will help us avoid last-minute changes to collection times in future, for example in response to severe weather, and the disruption we know this causes for you. It will enable consistency too for our crews.

We recognise that many people will be used to seeing crews on their street at particular times, and so we'll be sharing this change across all our available channels.

If you know someone who may not otherwise see the message - for example those who aren't online or have regular access to news, or who may find it harder to adjust - please do share this with them.
