#### Improving the cross-county health services interface

Revd Canon Andrew Vaughan recently arranged a meeting to discuss concerns raised by parishioners regarding access and provision of health and social care for those registered at Collingham Medical Centre, but living in Lincolnshire.

The meeting was attended by parish councillors from Swinderby, North Scarle, Eagle & Swinethorpe parish councils, Revd Vaughan and representatives from the Collingham health centre.

A productive discussion ensued where key areas were identified that impacted on patient care across the county border and where the interface between the service provision for the two counties needs to be improved.

A letter is being compiled to send to councils and healthcare management alike to try to suggest ways of improving the continuity of care for our parishioners registered at Collingham surgery.

To further emphasise and add impact to the letter we would welcome any personal experiences our parishioners may have relating to this topic, where patients being treated in a Lincolnshire acute or secondary care setting have had difficulties joining up this care with their Nottinghamshire based primary care service.

Any examples you wish to share can be anonymised if preferred and either sent to Revd Vaughan or a Parish Councillor to be distributed with the letter.

Our aim is to improve the integration of care across county borders to improve outcomes and experiences of our parishioners.

#### LETTERS FROM CANON REV. ANDREW

Aug 15th Hello

Over the last few months I have been reflecting on the whole nature of inclusion within the church. So many churches have big banners outside say "Everyone Welcome", but so often behind that banner lies nothing but discrimination, and really only a welcome for "those who are like us".

It strikes me that the ministry of welcome is of greater importance for village churches than those in our urban centres, as in towns and cities there is likely to be another church just around the corner.

This was then brought home both through the current book I am reading, and the recent ministers' conference in the diocese. The book discusses how people are treated in some churches if they express doubt, often bullied into either toeing the line, or forced out. The ministers' conference then looked at how our understanding of our humanities is changing, and how much of that leaves many of us confused. We heard of people again being bullied if they dared step outside traditional norms.

Village churches have to be a place where we accept we are all different, and that together we have to learn how to love and journey together. Often these differences are small, such as which football team, political party, type of music we like, often they are big questions, "who am I, and how do I understand myself, before God and my brothers and sisters". We have to learn to listen to each other and offer a welcome of inclusion, not just attendance, but sharing in all we do.

In the next few months I will be asking our PCCs to look at how we clearly state that welcome TO ALL, not just a soundbite, clever meme, but in our words and actions. After all Jesus welcomed everyone into his presence.



The children have only been back at school for a couple of weeks and they have settled in brilliantly. It has been an absolute pleasure to visit the classrooms and see what they've been up to and how busy they have been already. If you have seen children heading to and from school, you may have seen everyone has brand new school rucksacks thanks to FOES – they look amazing and really shows us as Team Eagle.

#### **Bikeability**



We have already had some exciting extra activities in school for Year 5 and 6 with their Bikeability training already taken place. Learning to be safe on the road and aware of others is so important for our children's safety and their travel in and around their community as they get older and begin to develop more independence. There was A LOT of rain but Class 4 and their trainers from Outspoken

Training battled the elements and achieved their goals. The children have been given the confidence to use their cycles by developing cycling skills, creating positive attitudes towards road users and their increasing knowledge and understanding of the rules of the road. The children worked hard and certainly earnt their badges – it's a well done from us!

#### **Titivating Trees**

If you ever walk near to school, you may notice that we have started the first phase of our 'tree treatments'. Our arborist will firstly look after the trees on the field, trimming and cutting them back. Then later on, work will begin in the Gruffalo Wood. Any works should not impact



any areas around the outside periphery of the school, and we thank you for your understanding if any sections are temporarily cordoned off for your safety while the works are carried out and tidied up (however we don't expect this to be the case). Thank you.


## Fosse Green Energy Community Consultation 11 September to 20 October 2023



Fosse Green Energy is holding an initial consultation on plans for a new solar and energy storage park south west of Lincoln, in North Kesteven.

The project has the potential to generate the electricity for approximately 110,000 typical UK households and includes areas for solar photovoltaic panels, energy storage infrastructure and connection corridor options to transfer electricity underground into the national grid.

We welcome your views and feedback to help us develop the project's design, and plan to hold a further stage of public consultation at a later date.

#### SPOTLIGHT ON EAGLE HALL

In this edition we take a close look at the structure of our village and its community. Eagle is somewhat unusual in that we have our core village centre, which is surrounded by several small hamlets, one of which is Eagle Hall.

Steeped in history, during the 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> centuries Eagle Hall was the home of the Knights Templar and Knight Hospitallers. At the time the community had associated links with the development of Lincoln Cathedral. Evidence of their preceptory still exists today, with the moat and earthworks in and around the parkland of Eagle Hall House.

There are many myths and legends about Eagle Hall, one of which is that there was once a tunnel from the Manor House to Eagle Church, however no evidence has ever been seen of this so far!

Located approximately 1 mile southwest of the village centre, Eagle Hall consists of about 20 properties which are home to about 50 residents. The age of the residential properties ranges from the 16<sup>th</sup> century to the present day; however, most are over 100 years old.

**Eagle Hall House**; Adding to the diversity of the community is Eagle Hall house, which is let on a long lease to a company that provides a home, care and schooling for the most disadvantaged children.

Historically Eagle Hall would have been a very busy and vibrant community with most of the residents working for the Eagle Hall Estate or its tenant farmers. Today the community is very diverse with a mix of those that work locally, to others that commute as far as London and those who are retired


and choose to enjoy the tranquility of the area.


Those visiting Eagle Hall will have noticed the opening up of the views of the hamlet following last winter's hedge laying and tree planting, and as a result the much-improved visibility splays at the Eagle/Swinderby road T junction. This work is all part of an ongoing investment program into the fabric of the hamlet. As well as the refurbishment of cottages, one of the most significant developments recently is the conversion of the redundant Victorian barns at Prestons Farm into 6 high specification residential barn conversions.

**Prestons Farm;** The key focus of this development was to maintain and build on the properties' rich heritage. To help maintain the hamlet's historic links, Lincoln Cathedral kindly donated waste timber and stone from the fabric of the Cathedral, which was all recycled and used for the internal features.




