Hello

As I sit to write these notes it is just before Remembrance Day, but I am focusing on December and Christmas, where has 2023 gone!

Once all the commercial side of Christmas eases it has always been one of my favourite times of the year. Spending time with the family, plenty of football and wonderful church services. Services ranging from our various Carols and Mince Pie services, through to the joy of Midnight Mass.

No one is an outsider, we are all on that journey, we will welcome you to exercise your gifts for who you are, not whether you re-enforce any existing group characteristics.

Please help us live and develop that welcome.

Hello Again from Eagle School .

We are rapidly racing through the Autumn term and as always, we are keeping ourselves very busy. But before you read on to find out some of our exciting activities, after 25 years in education and with this, my fifteenth year at Eagle School, I have made the decision to hang up my teacher's whistle and say farewell. I will of course miss Team Eagle tremendously; the children, the families past and present, the staff and governors and the community too, but as the Christmas term is such a magical and fun one, it is certainly an enjoyable one in which to say 'farewell'.

Rain, rain go away ... it's harvest time

Didn't we have a lot of rain! I'm sure you saw the field which looked more like a swimming pool at the end of October. Thankfully, apart from soggy grounds, we did not experience any damage but it did scupper our plans to hold our Harvest Service in the Church as we simply couldn't get across the playground without getting soaking wet. Not to be defeated, we recorded our service and shared it through our internal system. The whole school had a lovely afternoon together were incredibly grateful for the kind donations for our Harvest collection. The food items were taken to the Hykeham Foodbank to support our locality and I was lucky enough to get a tour of the provision and find out about the positive impact the service has for families in our area.

Year 5/6 Residential

As we returned after the half term, Year Five & Six prepared for their annual residential adventure. We enjoyed a few days away at Kingswood, Dearne Valley trying all sorts of activities from laser tag to zip lines and archery to the vertical playpen. The weather was kind enough to not stop us from doing all the activities and so got stuck in to test our comfort zones and develop many skills such as resilience, cooperation, confidence, patience, stamina and responsibility.

Forest Schools

After our whole school trip last year to Hill Holt Wood, this year we have arranged for Take2Adventure to lead two blocks of Forest Schools learning this term and then later in the year for the whole school. We are always thinking about other things that we can do and ways that we can teach to make our days different, engaging and exciting. So far the sun has shone and we have even had the red arrows flew by during our sessions. Each year group has had sessions on learning about and lighting fires, communication and creativity; problem solving and perseverance making storm shelters with tarps; and bug hunts in our Quiet Garden.

Active WOW Day

As well as enriching the curriculum with Forest School activities, working with Premier Education we have booked a series of 'WOW Days' to bring an extra boost to PE and fitness and encourage activity and healthy ways. Day One of exercises is complete and all the children have completed their WOW Active challenge. Coach Dan left certificates for Brady, Drake, Isla A-C, Beatrix, Alex S Tristan & Hollie for the highest scores in their fitness and activity trials.

Eagle School Football Team

Keeping with the sporting theme, our new football club has been running for a little while now and we have been grateful to Swinderby School for the opportunity to have both home and away matches during this term. This group have only been training for several weeks and showed tremendous resilience and determination to keep going and work as a team. Our second match showed a huge amount of development and resulted in an 'almost draw' which is a great result and highlights a consistency in attack and defence. Well done to the players, Coach 'Mr Hartnell' and thanks to the parents for being willing supporters.

Fellowship Lunch

Class 1 and Class 2 popped over to the Village Hall to entertain the ladies and gentlemen at the Fellowship Lunch on 24th November 23 to share a selection of

songs from the project and music learning. The theme was autumnal and gave us a chance to share some of our Harvest performance to an audience too.

Official Notice: Review of Polling Districts and Polling Places 2023



- Notice is hereby given that in accordance with Section 18C of the Representation of the People Act 1983 and Section 17 of the Electoral Registration and Administration Act 2013, North Kesteven District Council is conducting a review of the suitability of polling districts and polling places. The review will cover those polling districts and polling places within the boundaries of North Kesteven District Council.
- 2. The district of North Kesteven will be split between the three Parliamentary constituency boundaries of: Sleaford and North Hykeham; Grantham and Bourne; and Lincoln. The Acting Returning Officers for these Parliamentary constituencies that fall wholly or partially within North Kesteven will be consulted directly. All comments received will be published on our website.
- The Acting Returning Officer for the Parliamentary constituency of Sleaford and North Hykeham will comment and make proposals on the polling districts and polling places and those proposals will be published on the Council's website http://www.n-kesteven.gov.uk/pollingreview on 8 November 2023.
- 4. Any registered elector within the North Kesteven District Council area or from within a UK Parliamentary constituency, which has any part in the authority may comment on the proposals.
- 4. All comments received as part of the consultation will be made available for public inspection. The consultation period for this review will commence on 8 November 2023 and conclude at 5pm on 12 December 2023.
- 5. The Council would welcome the views of all residents, or any person or body with expertise in access for persons with any type of disability, on the proposed polling districts and polling places or any other related matters. The Council will consult with local political parties, MPs, district and county councillors, parish and town councils.
- Representations, where possible, should include alternative places that may be used as polling places and should be made in writing in the following ways:
 - email pollingreview@n-kesteven.gov.uk
 - completing the online form available on the Council's website at www.nkesteven.gov.uk/pollingreview
 - write to the Chief Executive, C/O Electoral Services (Polling Place Review), North Kesteven District Council, Kesteven Street, Sleaford, Lincs NG34 7EF.
- 7. The final proposals will be considered by the meeting of the Council on 25 January 2024 and the outcome of the review will then be published on the Council's website at www.n-kesteven.gov.uk/pollingreview If approved the proposals will come into effect on 1 February 2024 when the revised Electoral Register is published.


