#### **Editor's Note**



# Richard Johnston District Councillor for Skellingthorpe & Eagle (including Swinethorpe), Nth Scarle, Doddington & Whisby February Report

Flooding - a number of residential properties have suffered from the threat and actual flooding. I myself have twice watched flood water creep up my garden threateningly towards the house! I also know, from first hand, the impact that flood water has had of my 'patch', particularly with Skellingthorpe and homes flooded in North Scarle with the invasive overflow of sewage into homes! Some concerns also with ground water threatening to flood both in Eagle& Doddington. Roads have been closed and some remain so, with sandbags in evidence bringing additional problems to work around. My thoughts go to those suffering in our area.

The confusion over getting to know who's responsibility it is, this has been particularly frustrating with Water Authorities, Internal Drainage Boards, Councils & the Environmental Agency all involved; but lack of clarity on who does what, has delayed getting things done! The NKDC has a relatively small official role and the impact it can make within its areas of responsibility. These are mainly with its tenants and the timely provision of sand bags. Although our Officers and Councillors are involved across the District. The response to sandbag distribution from NKDC has been excellent in supporting the Parish Councils who are coordinating locally, with the provision of sand containers & sand. The importance of a local emergency plan has been highlighted with now 2 flooding incidents in such a short space of time. Some Parish Councils have well developed Emergency Plans in place.

#### LIVES - CPR Workshops

But as well as this, the children had the opportunity to learn about CPR and the defibrillator – particularly pertinent as our school de-fib arrived in the summer and is mounted in the corridor. We have signed up to the national scheme so responders know



we have a defibrillator on site that they can utilise in an emergency.

We opened up Little Eagles in December to anyone who would like to come and see our setting in action and join in the fun for an hour of Stay & Play across the Early Years area. This gave visitors the chance to see the Playroom, the Reception Classroom and the outside spaces (albeit a little chilly). If you or anyone you know has a child



looking for pre-school nursery places, please let them know we are happy to show them around at any time.

#### Busy, busy, busy December 2023

We were very busy before the end of the Autumn term when we shared our project gallery with parents, where our children displayed their project homework which they created to support their Autumn learning. The Parish Council has 2 vacancies, if you are interested in becoming a parish councillor or would more information, please contact the parish clerk or speak to any member of the committee.

A new polling notice has been displayed, advising the residents of Doddington & Whisby Parish that they will now cast their votes at Eagle Village Hall for the upcoming elections.

The CCTV camera at the playing field is still broken, after it was vandalised earlier in the year.

The blocked culvert at Swinderby Station has been reported as a complaint to Network Rail, Councillors are meeting with representatives from Network Rail to highlight blockage being the main reason why the station carpark floods.

The memorial plaque which has been damaged and removed from one of the benches at the park, will be replaced by the Parish Council.

A request for yellow lines to be applied to the entrance to Harrier Hill, and the junction of Thorpe Lane & High Street has been received. Cllr Alan Briggs, the County Councillor is going to investigate the possibility, Parking Enforcement is now a civil matter and the responsibility of Lincolnshire County Council, not the Police.

#### Planning -

Retention of portal framed building and associated yard hardstanding, plus retention of base for future erection of polytunnel and siting of solar PV panels on portal framed building. Land at Beehive Lane, Eagle Barnsdale. Ref – 23/1344/FUL.

The Parish Council had 'no comment' to make for this application.

## Watercourses—who is responsible for maintenance of ditches and culverts?

Since the heavy rains in the past couple of months, many of the drainage courses in the village have been challenged to the point of overflowing. The Parish Council has sought information from the Internal Drainage Board to help everyone understand who should maintain watercourses where they are adjacent to property.

Two leaflets have been made available, and will be posted on the Parish Council website, and the Eagle facebook pages along with this issue of the Eagle Eye. They give quite detailed definitions of responsibilities.

If you own land with a watercourse running through it, along its boundaries, or under it, you have certain rights and responsibilities that in legal terms make you a "riparian owner".

The leaflets help to explain what this means and whether you might be a riparian owner of an ordinary watercourse.

Responsibilities of riparian owners include ( but are not limited to ):

- Not obstructing the flow of a watercourse to the detriment of neighbours
- Keeping structures clear and free from obstruction
- Not allowing the watercourse to become polluted
- Seeking permission to use herbicides to control weeds in water or on the banks next to a watercourse

#### DINE IN STYLE AT THE CASTLE HOTEL

To commence my dining experience I opted for EGG ROYALE. This proved to be an excellent choice, with my taste buds being very appreciative. For main I selected COD, SMOKED SALMON & PRAWN FISHCAKE (Pickled Cucumber & Dill Salad, Tomatoes, Rocket & Rouille). The complementing flavours were outstanding and, certainly, 'Compliments to Chef', were duly sent. Being packed, succulent, tender and flavoursome, plus the excellent presentation, this dish impressed me, greatly. Head Chef, Simon Hibberd, ensures perfection, with his brigade. Other popular main course choices included Braised Blade of Beef and Twice Baked Cheese Souffle, amongst others.


