A lovely letter received from Natalie from the Village Shop & Post Office

It is with a heavy heart that I am writing to let you know that Eagle Village Shop & Post Office will be closing in July. There are numerous factors that have led to this decision, but the overriding reason is that it is no longer financially viable to keep it open. We have persevered with electricity costs tripling and mortgage rates rising significantly, however at the end of 2023 Royal Mail ended their rental agreement on the sorting office at the rear of the shop (This is why we no longer have our own village postie) and recently Post Office have removed the National Lottery service from all branches. With this service / rental being removed the business is now losing over £12,000 per year which is a huge amount for a small business to absorb. The shop has been up for sale since last summer. Post Office have (rightly so!) been in the news for all the wrong reasons and I am sure this has contributed to the lack of interest. Add to this the financial loss we are now facing and it is not surprising that we have been unsuccessful in selling it. We have therefore decided that we need to close. The shop has been a part of village life for over 20 years and I am sorry that it will no longer be here. It has also played a huge part in our family's life and we feel privileged to have been the custodians of it for the last 5 years. The friendships we have made are long lasting and I could write a book about some of the stories I have been told / been witness to! Thank you to every single person that has supported the shop and post office, it means so much. Thank you also to Anne, Katy, Christine and Chrissie who have helped and supported me to keep the shop running, they are all amazing and I am truly grateful to them. We plan to close in July and services will run as normal until then. Once we have a definite date closure I will display it in the shop window. This has been an incredibly difficult decision to make and I am sad to be closing.

Thanks again for your support and understanding, Natalie, Paul and Family

Question – An elderly family member needs some new shoes but because of poor mobility cannot go shopping. How can I measure her feet at home so I can order the correct shoes online?

Answer – Foot size gauges, the types which all shoe shops have can now be purchased online. Amazon have a range for both children and adult feet. Average cost is around £10.00

Question – Are next of kin responsible for care home fees after a family member dies?

Answer – When a resident dies in a care home, next of kin will not have to pay any outstanding care home fees, as this will be taken from the deceased person's estate unless a specific contract has been signed with the care home, saying you will do so.

Question – Are incontinence products free?

Answer - Incontinence products on the NHS may be free but it depends on the local integrated care board (ICB). Ask your GP for details of your local continence service who can advise you.

LETTERS FROM CANON REV. ANDREW VAUGHAN

Hello (Sent 09/04/24)

As I write this set of ramblings my mind flits between work, and the will we won't we debate of whether The Imps will make it into the play offs.

After a week off, post Easter, I am also very conscious of the importance of place. During the week off I travelled the length and breadth of the country, with football to Carlisle and Reading, and to Newport in South Wales, where I had to check on my parents grave, but also got in 2 days of bird watching, in Newport, and a new nature reserve that was in one of my former parishes, and which was being talked about as we left there in 1989.

All of this travelling reminded me that we are all shaped by place, and that one of the beauties of the Church of England, is that through the parish system, and in the past with its support of chaplaincy, it is a symbol that place is sacred.

For our group of parishes we have 4 beautiful villages, that can be places of flourishing, and above all hope. If we think about it the disciples recognised the Risen Jesus, in specific places. A symbolic reminder that hope breaks into those places and contexts that are significant to us.

As I sit and write this piece, I am still waiting to see my first Swift of the year. These marvellous birds migrate from the southern parts of Africa to breed here, and spend most of their lives on the wing. Normally I have seen plenty of these beauties by the end of April.

While we have had bad weather, the April cold/wet snap the absence of Swifts makes me ask are there greater issues at play, such as environmental change. Over recent months I have heard of arable farmers having to re-plant crops at least 3 times due to the unprecedented rainfall of the autumn and winter. What this will do for food security in the coming months must be of great concern.

For me the created order is a window into the beauty of God, the gift of God, and here we are on the precipice of that beauty collapsing.

During the Trinity season the main colour in our churches will be green, so altars will have green frontals, clergy vestments will be green. It is seen as a season of growth. How do we grow with a sensitivity to our created order? The World Council of Churches promoted the mission statement of Justice, Peace and the Integrity of Creation. If any one of these links break there is the potential for destructive chaos.

I hope and pray however we stop and ponder, contemplate or pray we grow in a sensitivity to our world.

By the way, I was only feeling flat after Lincoln didn't get into the play offs, as we had an uphill battle, but as ever I am hopeful and looking forward to next season.

Hello again to everyone from your PPG (Patient Participation Group) at Collingham Medical Centre; serving Collingham and several surrounding villages. We are volunteers who meet regularly to share information and support the work of the medical centre staff.

PPG Noticeboard and FFT surveys

Our new noticeboard has been installed in the Medical Centre waiting room (On the right hand wall near the entrance). Please look out for notices displayed there about who we are and the work we do. Next to the noticeboard is a Perspex box containing some feedback forms called 'Friends and Family Test'; we always welcome feedback about the Medical Centre and will do our best to address any concerns, as well as receiving compliments!

AGM - Monday 3rd June

The AGM for the Patient Participation Group will be held at 10am on Monday 3rd June, at the 'old 'library', adjoining the Medical Centre. You are welcome to come along to this meeting and hear about the work we do; you may even be thinking of getting involved yourself? We are happy to answer any questions you may have about our role.

COVID Spring booster vaccinations

At our April meeting, Collingham Medical Centre let us know that the spring booster vaccinations for COVID will be carried out between 15thApril and 30thJune. Patients who are eligible to receive this booster will be invited to attend, although priority will be given, as always, to those patients who are either care home residents or are housebound.

Mini Fridge

Collingham Medical Centre are very pleased and appreciative to have been supported by Collingham Village Care group to purchase a very useful portable 'mini fridge' for storing and transporting vaccines to patients.

Collingham Pharmacy

Paper prescriptions processing box

For those of you who are given paper prescriptions by the GP, rather than queuing in the pharmacy to hand these in , please place them in the designated box on the front counter of the pharmacy. They are processed regularly and the pharmacy aim not to make your wait too long.

Services offered by the pharmacy

A reminder that the pharmacy can now offer services for the following: Sinusitis (12 years and over); Sore throat (5 years and over); Acute Otis Media/Ear infection (1-17 years old); Infected insect bite (1 year and over); Impetigo (1 year and over); Shingles (18 years and over); Uncomplicated UTI (Women 16-64 years); Blood pressure readings; Starting contraception and ongoing prescriptions; Emergency Contraception and Weight loss services.

The pharmacy is now offering recycling services for; batteries, glasses, Inhalers and insulin pens. The recycling bins can be found beside the front door of the pharmacy, within a large wooden box.

The PPG are looking forward to future local events where we hope to meet more of you and hear

your points of view, ideas and suggestions.

DINE IN STYLE: THE BRONZE PIG

Having a very long history, the city of Lincoln attracts a vast amount of visitors, with a good number coming from overseas. Visitors, plus locals and residents, delight in Lincoln and Lincolnshire all year round. Certainly, the splendour of Lincoln's Cathedral and the very impressive Castle draw visitors constantly, with both venues offering guided tours and also having extremely popular events throughout the year. The tours and events are regularly booked well in advance. Eateries and restaurants, in Lincoln, offer something for all requirements – be it tea/coffee, through snacks, to fine dining and banquet occasions.

I located The Bronze Pig (opened 2015) in the historic quarter of Lincoln and was truly welcomed by Pompeo. The Bronze Pig is renowned in Lincoln and the name is inspired by Sicilian-born proprietor Pompeo Siracusa, who is also accomplished in the knowledge of fine wines. This Michelin Guide-listed restaurant has numerous regular diners.

To commence my visit, at a lunch time, I chose Ox Tongue Hash (Crispy quail egg, spring salad, redcurrant). A most excellent starter, having very good flavours and texture.

For the main course I opted for Miso Cod (Honey baby beets, ginger, tenderstem pickled enoki, sweet potatoes). This arrived with aromas to entice and an impressive presentation - 'Compliments to Chef'. The complementing flavours of ingredients were superb. Head Chef, Daniel and the team continually create the most impressive delectations. Other main course choices included beef, duck and pork.

For dessert, Champagne Poached Pear (Victoria sponge, lime sorbet) - just perfect!

Quality wines and drinks are available and include a splendid Sauvignon Blanc, which was notably sought-after by royalty and nobility that includes Louis Philippe and Napoleon. Parties, occasions and private functions are easily accommodated. Thank you to Janine for exemplary service throughout.

The Bronze Pig offers exceptional fine dining experiences, plus individually -designed, luxury en-suite guest rooms. Bookings are advisable for popular times. 
