Update on collecting donations for the Eagle Eye.

Following on from the great response to the questions posed about raising some funds for the Eagle Eye, the plan was to have launched an appeal during February and March.

However, as we are still in the grip of lockdown and all the strains upon normal life that imposes, we will leave this until later in the year.

In the mean time, we will be looking at the easiest ways to enable collection of donations, both in person and electronically—so watch this space next month, when we hopefully might be in a position to do more than we can at present.

Update on Parish Council grant projects.

You may recall that the Parish Council was given a Small Business Grant & Retail, Hospitality & Leisure Grant of £10,000, and they asked for ideas from the village about how this should be spent. The Parish Council has decided the following:

A good response was received, and it was decided unanimously at the last meeting (minutes of which have not yet been agreed and signed off, so are not yet available) to investigate purchasing four sets of traffic calming signs, similar to those in Thorpe on the Hill. This was the most-suggested idea of those submitted and the one which will benefit most of the village population.

Letter from Rev Andrew Vaughan

Hello everyone,

It seems so strange that for nearly 12 months getting together to socialise has been very difficult. Even to do something simple has meant detailed planning, with no room for spontaneity. Yet in the midst of this there are glimmers of hope, we are seeing the roll out of vaccines, the continued development of treatments. Being heavily involved with football I have come to value Professor Jonathan Van Tam's analogies, reminding us we are now in the penalty shoot out of a final and have to keep our nerve to see it through to victory.

As you will have seen, the Churchwardens, PCC and myself took the difficult decision to suspend public worship on grounds of community safety. While we were confident that our protocols were robust, we simply didn't want to take risks with the concerns about the variant Covid-19 strain. We are able to hold funerals with about 20-25 in attendance.

Amidst this concern though there is always signs of hope. As I sit in my study writing this I can hear a Great Tit, with its monotonous "Teacher, teacher, teacher" call, a sign of spring, a sign of hope for new life. I hope and pray that in the coming weeks we can all find signs of hope.



Footpaths, Farm Land and Dog Mess

To all that live in Eagle Village— my Home and my Place of Work.

It saddens me to write this article but after the last couple of years it has come to the point of having to put pen to paper. I am the farmer that has the land adjacent to the park, and either side of New Lane off Thorpe Road, Eagle.

As times change in our modern world, sometimes not for the better, we are encouraged by programmes such as Country File and the like to go out and enjoy the countryside. And why not, as the countryside is a beautiful place for all to enjoy, especially with the current pandemic we are in. We are constantly being told to stay at home, so a walk around the village or to the park or even a little further is just what the doctor ordered.

I and my family are very lucky to live on the edge of the village and to farm some of the land around the village. However, over the past 5 years or so and even more so over the past 18 months, we feel a little invaded by the public sometimes not sticking to the footpaths that have been created by my family over the years down the side of our fields and out onto the farm track. You may have noticed over the past few weeks two new signs that have gone up basically saying private no entry, We have put these up as more and more people think its ok to walk a different route from the park past our house, around our garden and into our yard and out towards the road or in reverse from the road up our drive around our house and either around our fields to our farm track or to the park. Neither way is a footpath, and I ask you to please stick to the footpaths provided.

With walking and owning dogs getting ever popular again it saddens me to have to ask you to kindly take your dog mess home with you and not just leave it laying in the verge for other people to view or worse tread in (or me climbing around in dykes making sure my drains are working and having to look hard first in the over growth to make sure I don't put my hand in it). Some of the public seem to thinks its ok to bag it up and either leave it laying there or try to throw the bag unsuccessfully over the hedge and leave it hanging there off a branch. How can this be enjoying the country side?? For those of you that bag it up but leave it surely you've done the hard part by bagging it up?? Please take it home with you even—the tv series Countryfile touched on the subject a few weeks ago.

The track down to the old irrigation pits is NOT the route to the newly constructed footpath made by the Tarmac group, who have recently quarried the gravel and sand out. Please do NOT feel free to walk down the track for a look around and then turn round to walk back again. I seem to be constantly picking up litter from around the ponds in that area as people think its easier to just leave it for someone else to clean up after them. Same as New Lane—the litter is starting to be a problem, please take your litter home with you along with your dog mess. Myself and some kind people out of the village have better things to do than pick rubbish up on a weekly basis because some of you can't be bothered. ITS NOT FAIR ON US.

One for the Children of the village.

The park has been kindly provided by the Parish Council and maintained by them at sometimes great expense to their budget, for the children of the village to enjoy. My farm land is not council owed and doesn't get funded by the Parish Council and it most defiantly isn't a play park. Could you please use the park provided for you and not my dykes and fields. My fields are not race tracks for your motorbikes and push bikes and my dykes flow better without dams and bridges that seem to now get constantly built.

My fields are my livelihood and the crops that I grow, grow better in the ground rather than being pulled up and thrown about or being trampled on by gangs of kids. Please do not do it, we are being taught to enjoy the countryside and respect it, not destroy it.

I find it hard to believe that people say they want to enjoy the countryside but yet they fail to understand that by treating it the way they do they are ruining it for others. All I seem to be doing nowadays is chasing people off where they're not supposed to be.

Enjoy New Lane and the footpaths around the Tarmac Quarries but please, nowhere else.



Eagle Memorial Project

In these dark days of winter when everything feels gloomy, at last there is some good news to report about the memorial project.

We have finally received the official permission from the diocese to place the memorial in the churchyard.

So, I have at last been able to give a deposit of £3000 to Leakes Masonry, the company who are going to make the memorial, so that they can now order the granite.

Having paid the deposit we can claim the £1000 from North Kesteven Council that we won in a bid for a grant. Together with a donation of £250 from RAF Scampton and a further donation pledged, we now have the funds to cover the payment of £7140 that is needed for the memorial.

This means that after 3 years of fund raising we can look forward to the day when our memorial, dedicated to the 4 airmen who died in the village during WW2, will finally be in place between the trees at the end of the churchyard near to the War Memorial Arch.

The sadness is that Mr Ray Brewer and Mr Bill Linton, who were instigators of the project and providers of so much information, will not be with us to see the fruits of their labours. Nor Mrs Sheila Meanwell who has told us the story for perpetuity. RIP Ray, Bill and Sheila.





The Trees over hanging the Playing Field Carpark & BMX track are to be pruned back.

General Information

The Parish Council received the Small Business Grant & Retail, Hospitality & leisure Grant of £10,000. Possible spending options for the money had been received from residents with the final decision yet to be made.

The Community Speed watch scheme has been put on hold, the Parish Council are now looking into more permanent speed signs for the village.

Thanks were passed onto Tarmac for providing a lovely area to walk round with all paths clearly marked and local to the village.

Swinderby Station Carpark.

The Community Ambassador from East Midlands Trains had been contacted regarding funding for the upkeep of the station carpark. The overhanging trees next to the station have been pruned back with the flooding at the carpark being investigated by Lincolnshire County Council and East Midlands Trains.

The Parish Council are considering the station adoption scheme, with the support of the volunteers from Collingham Station Adoption Group. Volunteers from Eagle & Swinderby parishes would be needed to form a group to apply for additional funding.


