#### Notice from Revd Canon Andrew Vaughan

Hello everyone

As you know on February 22<sup>nd</sup> the Prime Minister set out the government's plans to ease the social restrictions put in place to control the spread of Covid-19. Soon after that announcement we started thinking about our own roadmap to resume activities within the life of our churches across the group. Obviously, these are all dependent on how and when restrictions are relaxed.

In many senses this process is like a pilgrimage journeying to discover God in the midst of our changed world.

So to our plans. Our first act of public worship will be on March 21<sup>st</sup> at Eagle Church at 10.30am. This will take the form of Morning Prayer. This gives us the opportunity to check that our Risk Assessment is still appropriate. For Palm Sunday we will be back online.

During Holy Week we will have our regular Morning and Evening Prayer at 9am and 6pm on the North Scarle Church Facebook page. Then on Maundy Thursday we are planning a short outdoor Communion Service at 4pm at Swinderby. We will use the tabletop grave just outside the door for this. On Good Friday we will hold an outdoor Good Friday Service at 2pm at Eagle. Obviously, these two are weather dependent, and if we have bad weather will be moved inside.

On Easter Day we will formally return to services inside each Church. These will be

9.30am Easter Communion, Swinderby, 9.45am Easter Communion, North Scarle

11.00am, Easter Communion, Eagle, 11.00am, Easter Communion, Thorpe on the Hill

For the rest of April we will hold services at 10.30am as follows

11th April Holy Communion, Swinderby, 18th April Holy Communion, Eagle

25<sup>th</sup> April. Holy Communion. Thorpe on the Hill.

The next stage of our roadmap will start in May when we re-introduce some evening services. This pattern will continue for June and July. From July we would hope that the services will be group services where all are welcome. Details of these will be announced in April.

Also, from the start of July we hope that we can resume Coffee Mornings, then September the monthly lunches. These will be dependent on Government advice.

From September we will be launching a new rota of services, which will include singing if allowed. To celebrate this I am planning to do a sponsored run between the 4 churches on the first Sunday of September. At each church we will have a different part of the service. If there are any runners who would like to accompany me for all or part. I will put out details in a month or so.

#### Collingham Medical Centre newsletter 13/3/21

The Patient Participation Group (PPG) in conjunction with Collingham Medical Centre (CMC) have had a virtual meeting where the main topic was, of course, the Covid 19 vaccination programme across Nottinghamshire. Currently there are now 9 sites delivering across the county and city;

Queen's Medical Centre, City Hospital, King's Mill Hospital, Ashfield Health Village, Carlton Richard Herrod Centre, Nottingham Kings Meadow Campus, Newark Showground, Cripps Health Centre and Gamston Community Hall.

My own experience was very straightforward. I received my invitation letter, logged onto the website given in the letter and was able to choose Newark Showground for an appointment within the week. I was most impressed to receive the second appointment at the same time. I was processed with professional friendliness. Seeing all those people, many of them volunteers made me grateful to belong to such a community. Thanks to all concerned.

Keep up to date with which cohorts the Nottinghamshire Covid Vaccination Programme are supporting @ COVID-19 Vaccination in Nottingham and Nottinghamshire - NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire CCG (nottsccg.nhs.uk). Lots of further information is available on the link.

There is a significant increase in Covid vaccine expected and the Nottinghamshire Programme has asked GP practices to support this delivery. CMC will be hosting, as an extended hours service, a Saturday clinic on March 27th followed by the 2nd dose on June 12th. Some of the PPG members will be supporting on the mornings of these clinics.

CMC are a research practice and as such they have shared the link on *How are Covid* -19 vaccines being developed so quickly? - YouTube

**Practice news** Dr Karen Fearn will be taking a short sabbatical from clinical work to spend time with family. She will continue to support the practice as a Partner and Clinical Supervisor. CMC are pleased to welcome Dr Francis Dasilva for 6 months April - September 2021.

**Pharmacy News** Dispensaries have been working to a 3 working day turnaround and it is hoped to revert to 2 working days after Easter as the full team are integrated back into the original dispensing areas.

CMC practices in accordance to the Nottinghamshire CCG 28 Day Prescribing Policy and the PPG have suggested that we start a campaign focusing on the value of wasted medicines and to ask that we all only request the medicines we actually need.



## Cagle Village Hall

Eagle Village Hall is located at the heart of the village, next to the memorial arch on the High Street.

The hall is run as a non-profit making charity organisation, providing communal facilities for the benefit of the village and surrounding communities. Other than recent funding support from NKDC ( thanks to Covid ) the maintenance committee relies entirely on booking fees and donations to keep the hall open and a warm secure environment.

It was recently upgraded to improve access for the less abled among us and now includes a ramp and automatic front door for easy access. The management committee ensures the maintenance of the building, and its availability for possible functions and clubs as and when required.

The hall hosts a large main room with seating for up to 80 people, a raised stage, and a fully fitted kitchen. Throughout the year it is normally in regular use by local groups such as crafts club, bowls club, exercise classes, parent and toddlers group, community fellowship lunches, fund raisers and celebrations, with special discounts applied for village residents.

Facilities include WiFi, overhead projector ( 2020 ) with screen and PA system available for parties, discos, bingo and film nights etc..

Once we are allowed to move freely and safely again bookings can be made via Facebook, phone or email or contacting Jackie Jinks (Booking Secretary) directly. Contact numbers below.

### Cagle Village Produce Association

The VPA has been running for as long as I can remember (I grew up in Eagle), and I have good memories of entering the shows both as a child and as an adult. Sadly I don't know exactly when the shows started but can say that 2020 would have been the 60<sup>th</sup> Open (Autumn) Show, and hopefully we might be able to celebrate that milestone in 2021.

Both the Spring and Open (Autumn) Shows follow the same format; although the Spring Show has considerably less classes. It is 25p for each exhibit you bring to enter. All entries are judged anonymously and the judges are not on the committee. We rely on their expertise and willingness to come voluntarily each year to support our shows. They also help us to make sure the right plant or flower is in the right class!!

Once the winner has been identified points are awarded for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> places and then the individual with the most points across that class wins a trophy or cup. Many of the cups have been used for a considerable time, perhaps since the very beginning of the VPA; cups are presented to the winning exhibitors at the end of the show by someone from the community, along with the drawing of the raffle. We also give a certificate and monetary prize for those winning; although it's not a life changing amount!

The Spring Show comes first, the show schedule is always printed in the Eagle Eye, and is mostly about spring flowers that you have growing in your garden, and it is a wonderful way to celebrate the end of those gloomy dark days of winter with some splashes of colour. We also try to encourage those who are not so green fingered, and have classes for exhibiting your favourite pot plant, flower arranging (floral art) and photography; we also try to engage the younger members of the community with a Childrens class (always open to ideas for this one).

The Open (Autumn) Show (schedule also printed in the Eagle Eye) celebrates nature's bounty; vegetables, fruit, flowers and roses, home produce (cakes and preserves) and all types of crafts as well as floral art, photography and a Children's class.







While we realise that you may prefer to speak to the local highways officer directly, we need them out dealing with highways issues not in the office on the phone. For more complex, ongoing issues, you can request an annual meeting with your local member and the highways team.
